DRAINAGE PROJECT APPROVED

Drainage improvements are to be addressed through the Lily Park Stormwater Retrofit Project scheduled for construction in January, 2017.

The project design involves adding approximately eight hundred and seventy-five linear feet of pipe to direct stormwater from Seventh Avenue along the east side of S. Riverside Drive to the existing drainage inlet at Tenth Avenue. Additionally, a drainage retention area (dra) approximately fifty feet by one hundred feet will accept most of the stormwater diverted to it from the weir in the pipe. The dra will be approximately three and one-half foot to four foot deep and will be constructed immediately south of the existing Lily Park. The area of the dra equates to approximately one thousand, nine hundred and fifty linear feet of roadside swale.

The project is funded by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) grant for thirty-eight percent of the eligible costs. The Town is funding the balance of the cost. Funding approval was granted by the State in November, 2015.

The project is intended to lessen flooding on S. Riverside Drive at Sixth Avenue and improve water quality in the Indian River Lagoon (IRL). The water quality will be improved by a significant amount of water that currently is discharged into the IRL (an impaired water body) being diverted to the dra.

The public is invited to a presentation on the project which will be held on Tuesday, December 6, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Indialantic Town Hall.



LOCATE FUTURE SIDEWALKS

Locating sidewalks is the topic of a forum scheduled for Thursday, December 8, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. Residents and business owners are invited to provide input into the development of a Master Sidewalk Plan for the Town of Indialantic the intent of which is to improve connectivity between destinations.

Jim LaRue, with LaRue Planning and Management Services, Inc, will lead the discussion on how best to serve pedestrian needs in preparing the plan. The discussion will commence on December 8th in the Town Hall Council meeting room, continue at 5:30 p.m. on January 24, 2017 at the Zoning and Planning Board meeting, and conclude with the adoption of the plan by Council on April 12, 2017.

The development of the plan is funded by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) through a Community Planning Technical Assistance Grant. This program helps Florida communities find creative solutions to fostering vibrant and healthy communities.

Recent Council Actions:

OCTOBER 12:

- Approved Interlocal Agreement with Brevard County for storm debris removal.
- Approved Amendment #1 to the Lily Drainage Stormwater Retrofit agreement with Florida Department of Environmental Protection.
- Adopted Ordinance 16-15 relating to signs on buildings on corner lots in the S-C, Shopping Center District.
- Authorized the engagement of design services to improve security in the Town Hall prisoner holding area.
- Approved removal of existing humps on Second and Third Avenues and authorized the purchase of one 7'x3" hump, and the purchase of two more without Council approval if proven satisfactory.
- Authorized the Craft Festival for July 8 and 9, 2017, in Nance Park.
- Rejected the proposed name of "Brooks Island" for the barrier island.
- Approved the Comprehensive Plan Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) and related letter.
- Accepted the Town Manager's performance evaluation for the period 10/1/2015 – 9/30/016.
- Authorized waiver of permit fees for damage caused by Hurricane Matthew at the sole discretion of the Building Official – fee waiver in force until 12/31/16.
- Authorized the Town Manager to enter into Adopt-A-Shore Agreements as appropriate.
- Approved revision of deliverable due dates relating to the Sidewalk Master Plan (DEO) Grant.
- Extended the Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement with Brevard County.
- Authorized an expression of appreciation to employees for efforts before and after Hurricane Matthew.

OCTOBER 25:

- Approved making application for a grant in the amount of \$50,000 for the FY-18 FRDAP cycle for improvements to Sunrise Park.
