Dune Crossovers Widened

Crossover widening continues with completion of the addition of seating areas to the tops of crossovers #10 and 12 and the Watson Drive crossover. The crossovers have also been strengthened and wood steps and deck areas replaced with Moisture Shield composite decking.

Council has approved adding a seating area to dune crossover #16, across from Fourteenth Avenue, replacing the wooden deck and steps with Moisture Shield, and replacing the current dune access from Wavecrest Avenue with pavers. Work will not commence on the crossover until sea turtle nesting season concludes after October 31, 2014.



Public Works adds the seating area to crossover #12.

Material costs for adding the dune seating areas, converting the surfaces to Moisture Shield, and strengthening crossovers is covered by revenue from the annual Witch Way 5k events.

This year's Witch Way 5k is scheduled for Saturday, October 11, 2014.

The Tampa Avenue dune crossover was previously improved in a similar manner.

The \$50,000 Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) grant also provided for play items known as the Wavebreak, Dayton Express, tilted skyrunner, two see saws, renovations to the regular and tot swings, two new picnic tables with concrete pad and access improvements to the northeast and southeast corners of the park.

Public Works personnel also recently renovated the track ride play item.

National Take Back Initiative

On Saturday April 26, 2014 from 10 AM to 2 PM the Indialantic Police Department, in conjunction with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will participate in a program to remove potentially dangerous prescription drugs from homes. The initiative provides an opportunity for citizens to safely turn over expired, unwanted or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances or other medications to law enforcement for destruction.

This one-day effort brings national attention to the issue of pharmaceutical controlled substance abuse. This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue and is also environmentally the safest way for disposal.

The program is completely anonymous and free of charge. Citizens who have unwanted prescription drugs can drop them off at the Indialantic Police Department at 220 Fifth Ave., Indialantic, Florida. All solid dosage pharmaceutical products and liquids in consumer containers will be accepted. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original containers with the cap tightly sealed to prevent leakage. Intravenous solutions, injectables and syringes will not be accepted due to potential hazards.

IRRIGATION RULES REMINDER

The St. Johns River Water Management District's watering regulations are as follows:

Daylight Savings Time: residential landscape irrigation is allowed on Wednesday and Saturday for odd numbered addresses, Thursday and Sunday for even numbered addresses and Tuesday and Friday for non-residential irrigation.

Eastern Standard Time: residential irrigation is limited to Saturday for odd numbered addresses, Sunday for even numbered addresses and Tuesday for non-residential irrigation.

In addition, no landscape irrigation is allowed between 10 am and 4 pm.

INDIALANTIC FIRE RESCUE



Our firefighters have been busy conducting annual fire inspections on the commercial and multi-family properties in Indialantic. You will soon be seeing our firefighters conducting our annual fire hydrant inspections, which requires us to fully open each fire hydrant and flow water from them. We do this in coordination with the City of Melbourne Water Department. If you experience cloudy water we ask that you attempt to flow water from a sink or outside spigot for a few minutes in an effort to clear the disturbed silt. If the water does not clear up call 321-608-5133 or 321-608-5130 Mon.-Fri. 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. or 321-255-4622 all other times and report the water condition to the Melbourne Water Department. Melbourne will send a crew out to flush the water lines in your area in order to clear the cloudy water.



We hope that everyone is enjoying our beautiful weather and getting out and visiting our local businesses.


